1. **Fill in the blank:** Complete the greeting with the correct French word.

Bonjour, comment _____ vous?

2. **Short answer:** How do you say “Goodbye” to a friend in French? Write the expression.

3. **Fill in the blank:** Complete the introduction with the correct form of the verb *appeler*.
Je ----- Marie.

4. **Short answer:** Write the French phrase you would use to ask someone their name (formal).

5. **Fill in the blank:** Complete the response with the correct French word.

6. **Short answer:** Write the French expression for “See you tomorrow.”

7. **Matching:** Match each French expression in Column A with its English equivalent in Column B. Write the letter on the line.

Column A

8. **Short answer:** Write the formal French phrase for “What is your name?” and the response “My name is Pierre.”

9. **Fill in the blank:** Complete the phrase with the correct French word.

Je suis (pleased) de vous rencontrer.

10. **Short answer:** Write the French phrase you would use to say “Good morning” to your teacher.

Answer Key

1. **Fill in the blank:** *Bonjour, comment allez vous?*
(The correct form of *aller* used with *vous* is *allez*.)
2. **Short answer:** *Salut* (informal goodbye to a friend) or *À bientôt* (see you soon).
(Both are acceptable informal farewells.)
3. **Fill in the blank:** *Je m'appelle Marie.*
(The reflexive verb *s'appeler* in the first person singular is *m'appelle*.)
4. **Short answer:** *Comment vous appelez-vous?*
(This is the formal way to ask someone's name, using inversion with *vous*.)
5. **Fill in the blank:** *Enchanté(e) de faire votre connaissance.*
(The expression *enchanté de faire votre connaissance* means “pleased to make your acquaintance.”)
6. **Short answer:** *À demain.*
(This literally means “until tomorrow.”)
7. **Matching:** 1–c, 2–e, 3–d, 4–a, 5–b
(*Salut* = Hi/Bye informal; *Comment ça va?* = How's it going?; *Au revoir* = Goodbye; *Bonsoir* = Good evening; *À bientôt* = See you soon.)
8. **Short answer:** *Comment vous appelez-vous?* (formal) and *Je m'appelle Pierre.*
(The formal question uses inversion; the response uses the reflexive verb *s'appeler*.)
9. **Fill in the blank:** *Je suis ravi(e) de vous rencontrer.*
(The adjective *ravi(e)* means “delighted” or “pleased.” The feminine form *ravie* is used by female speakers.)
10. **Short answer:** *Bonjour, Monsieur/Madame.*
(The standard formal morning greeting is *Bonjour*, and adding *Monsieur* or *Madame* shows respect to the teacher.)
